Un mensaje de su Párroco...

Hermanos y Hermanas,

Es el tercer domingo de la Pascua, y la iglesia continúa disfrutando de la Luz de la resurrección. Un tema que une las lecturas de esta semana es cómo la pasión y la resurrección de Jesús fueron prefiguradas en el Antiguo Testamento.

En la primera lectura de este domingo, San Pedro enfatiza que la vida y el trabajo de Jesús eran un cumplimiento de lo que Dios ya había prefigurado en los escritos de los profetas. Después de contar la historia básica del ministerio, pasión y resurrección de Jesús, anuncia: "Dios ha llevado a cumplir lo que había anunciado de antemano a través de la boca de todos los profetas, que su Cristo sufriría". ¡Arrepiéntete, por lo tanto, y se convierte!

Solo un par de profetas hablan explícitamente del sufrimiento de Cristo: quizás Isaías 53, Daniel 9:26 y algunos otros pasajes.

Entonces, ¿qué quiere decir Pedro: "Todos los profetas [dijeron] su Cristo sufriría?" Aquí entramos en presagios: muchas figuras justas como Abel, José, Job, David y Jeremías presagiaron los sufrimientos de Jesús al someterse a persecuciones sorprendentemente similares a lo que Jesús sufriría. David, por ejemplo, escribe sobre sus propios sufrimientos de manera hiperbólica en el Salmo 22, pero lo que resultó es una descripción casi literal de lo que Jesús experimentó en la cruz. Dios estaba (¡y está en control de la historia todo el tiempo, moviéndolo hacia sus objetivos para nuestra salvación).

En nuestra segunda lectura, nos estamos moviendo a través de 1 Juan. Esta breve carta del apóstol es como un simple catecismo, lleno de enseñanza clara y contundente sobre vivir la vida cristiana. Leemos de él durante la temporada de Pascua en beneficio de los recién bautizados, pero realmente es para todos recordar los conceptos básicos de la fe. Hay una línea sorprendente en el pasaje de hoy: "Aquellos que dicen: "Lo conozco", pero no mantengo sus mandamientos son mentirosos".

En todas las edades, hay cristianos que piensan que "conocen" mejor que Jesús e insisten en que la Iglesia necesita cambiar su enseñanza para "mantenerse al día con los tiempos". San Juan nos advierte que estas personas son falsos profetas. Si no viven por los mandamientos de Jesús, que son conservados por la Iglesia, sabemos que son "mentirosos", sin importar las otras credenciales civiles o eclesiales que puedan tener.

Nuestro Evangelio es el relato de Lucas de la aparición de Jesús a los Apóstoles después del famoso camino hacia Emaús. Jesús come frente a ellos para demostrar que no es un fantasma y luego afirma "todo escrito sobre mí en la ley ... los profetas y los salmos deben cumplirse". Nuevamente, vemos ese tema de cumplimiento de lo que se ha prefigurado. Entonces Lucas dice que, "abrió sus mentes para comprender las Escrituras". Eso es lo que sucede en cada misa. Leemos de la "Ley ... Profetas y Salmos", y luego el predicador explica cómo todo se cumple en Jesús.

Cada misa es como el encuentro de Jesús con los apóstoles en el Evangelio de hoy: compartimos una comida con Cristo resucitado (donde se ofrece como el cordero pascual), y "abre nuestras mentes para comprender las escrituras"!

Oremos en esta misa para que nuestras mentes se abran y que tengamos la gracia, como dice nuestra segunda lectura, para "mantener su palabra", para que "el amor de Dios esté realmente perfeccionado" en nosotros!



A message from your Pastor...

Brothers and Sisters,

It's the Third Sunday of Easter, and the Church continues to bask in the glow of the Resurrection. One theme that unites the readings this week is how the passion and resurrection of Jesus were foreshadowed in the Old Testament.

In the first reading for this Sunday, St. Peter emphasizes that the life and work of Jesus were a fulfillment of what God had already foreshadowed in the writings of the prophets. After recounting the basic story of Jesus' ministry, passion and resurrection, he announces: "God has thus brought to fulfillment what he had announced beforehand through the mouth of all the prophets, that his Christ would suffer. Repent, therefore, and be converted!"

Only a couple of prophets explicitly speak of the Christ suffering: perhaps Isaiah 53, Daniel 9:26, and a few other passages.

So what does Peter mean: "all the prophets [said] his Christ would suffer?" Here we go into foreshadowing: So many righteous figures like Abel, Joseph, Job, David and Jeremiah foreshadowed Jesus' sufferings by undergoing persecutions strikingly similar to what Jesus would undergo. David, for example, writes about his own sufferings in a hyperbolic way in Psalm 22, but what resulted is an almost-literal description of what Jesus experienced on the cross. God was (and is!) in control of history all the time, moving it toward his goals for our salvation.

In our second reading, we are moving through 1 John. This short letter from the apostle is like a simple catechism, full of clear and blunt teaching about living the Christian life. We read from it during the Easter season for the benefit of the newly baptized — but it really is for all of us to remember the basics of the faith. There is a striking line in today's passage: "Those who say, 'I know him,' but do not keep his commandments are liars."

In every age, there are Christians who think they know better than Jesus and insist the Church needs to change its teaching to "keep up with the times." St. John warns us that these people are false prophets. If they aren't living by the commands of Jesus, which are preserved by the Church, we know they are "liars," no matter what other civil or ecclesial credentials they may have.

Our Gospel is Luke's account of Jesus' appearance to the apostles after the famous Road to Emmaus encounter. Jesus eats food in front of them to prove he's not a ghost and then affirms "everything written about me in the law ... the prophets and psalms must be fulfilled." Again, we see that theme of fulfillment of what had been foreshadowed. Then Luke says that "he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures." That's what happens at every Mass.

We read from the "law ... prophets and psalms," and then the homilist explains how it all is fulfilled in Jesus.

Every Mass is like Jesus' encounter with the apostles in today's Gospel: We share a meal with the Risen Christ (where he offers himself as the Paschal Lamb), and He "opens our minds to understand the Scriptures."

Let's pray at this Mass that our minds be opened and that we have the grace, as our second reading says, to "keep his word," so that "the love of God is truly perfected" in us!
